FROM HER TOMB SITE

"This is the first opportunity I have to write to you, so I take it with pleasure for I know well that you have done so much for the Cause of Venerable Kateri Tekakwitha. We had a very quiet summer here so far as pilgrimages to the Shrine. Only one regular pilgrimage from a neighboring parish. The big pilgrimage from the Immaculate Conception did not come on account of transportation shortage. Just the same on Saturdays and Sundays and even on week-days we had many individual visits. One or two cars at a time, sometimes we had more.

"We thought for a time that Rome would be free from the war, but now with the Germans there, it is worse than before, so we will have to wait until after the war for the beatification of dear Kateri."

GOOD FORTUNE AND PROVIDENCE

"I cut the leading tendons of my left hand shutting off a porcelain faucet. I was in a Catholic hospital for nine days and went back, after being discharged from the ward, three times a week, for six months, for treatment. After the first five days they allowed me out of bed. That morning I went to the recreation room and picked up a book on the life of Blessed Catherine. That evening my mother-in-law came to see me and I told her about the book. It was my good fortune she had a relic of Kateri. From that day on when they changed the bandage I always had it wrapped again with the relic inside.

"The Sister Superior had informed my family that everything had been done that was possible, but it was very doubtful if I would ever use the hand again as they wanted to take the hand off at the wrist, and they expressed little doubt if the hand would heal if it was sewed up. But a miracle was performed by Blessed Catherine and today my hand is as useful as it ever was, and there is no noticeable difference in my hand except the surgery scar."
