# **VERY GOOD NEWS**

As our readers well know the Apostolic Process on one of the remarkable cures attributed to Venerable Tekakwitha was suspended awaiting the testimonies of the principal physician in the case and of the brother of the patient. They were off on military service, one overseas and one in a distant camp, both difficult to trace. Even after tracing them special instruction was needed for taking depositions and to get this by communication with Rome was painfully slow.

The January number of THE LILY OF THE MOHAWKS announced the receipt of this instruction. Just as soon as the whereabouts of the two witnesses had been traced, the acting chancellor of the diocese in which the remarkable cure had occurred lost no time im obtaining the needed testimonies and soon the Process complete will be on its way to the Congregation of Rites.

Some day the writer will tell how many obstacles stand in the way of having a Servant of God declared a Saint. Just now suffice it to mention some obstacles that threatened further delay, the absence of the bishop of the diocese owing to poor health; the inactivity of his chancellor who had been very serviously injured in an accident; and still another member of the tribunal conducting this Process in the hospital. In spite of all, the good work goes on. It is a reason for

thanksgiving to God, to His Servant Tekakwitha and to those who persist in adwancing her Cause no matter what obstacles come in the way. It is an occasion also for continued prayer that all may now proceed favorably.

## AT CAUGHNAWAGA AND LA PRAIREE

Sunday, May 20, was the hundredth anniversary of the blessing of the cornerstone which has been used in the six churches built on it during that time at Caughnawaga. On June 17 there will be an historical pageant to memorialize the origin of the farmous mission.

At La Prairie, a former site of the mission, about four miles down the great St. Lawrence, the pastor has ready a design for a permanent monumental cross to be erected over the tomb of Tekakwitha, and an impiting shelter for pilgrims who wish to pray at the site where from the time of her burial so many remarkable blessings have been obtained through her intercession.

And now we may join in the general exultation over the cessation of hostilities in Europe. Among the many petitions for the intercession of Tekakwitha none were more numerous and fervent than were those for the young men fighting there. April 4, 1945.

Dear Father:

Your kind letter of February 1st with the happy information that Ven. Katherine Tekakwitha's Cause for her canonization will rapidly proceed at Rome due to the examination of the second miracle attributed to her intercession brings joy to the hearts of the Indians and Eskimos of Alaska, who are most interested in the Cause of this Indian maiden.

While writing this letter, an Indian, who is descended from those tribes converted by our great Bishop Seghers, came into my room with an Easter offering to help meet my expenses of travel, and I do not think that I can do anything better than to send it to you to help along the Cause of Tekakwitha's canonization. May your zealous labors be soon crowned with success!
