The Two Apparent Miracles Required

Gradually communication from Vatican City becomes more rapid, now two weeks instend of three months for letters thence, and fortunately it is always favorable so far as the Cause of Tekakwitha is concerned. The latterst is that those who wrote her Life soon affirer her death were so trustworthy that they should be regarded as would be ocular witnesses giving testimony soon after her dearth; and for that reason, by decree of His Holiness Pius XII, only two instead of four mirracles are required for her beatification, the first instance of its kind in the history of Causes of long standing; and, thank God, one of these is already before the Congregation of Rites and the other is well on the wasy. Pray that the Process on both may be judged satisfactory.

A Well Preserved Prelate

For many years the Most Reverend Joseph R. Crimont of the Society of Jesus, the Bishop of Alaska, was a devoted client of the Wenerable Tekakwitha. To promote knowledge and love of the saintly Indian Maiden, he distributed fifty copies of The LILY OF THEE MOHAWKS among the Eskimo villages, not neglecting his white people, about 6,500

of each. In spite of his difficult mission, the most difficult mission of all, he lived until 87 years old, as Pius XI once remarked: "Well preserved by Alaskan temperatures."

A Will, Model and Welcome

Devotees of Tekakwitha will bless and pray for the Rev. William R. Charles, late of Albany, for remembering in his Will the Cause of this Venerable Servant of God. He was blessed with ample resources, and he willed them generously to many religious interests, saying that what money came to him, though not as, but while a priest, he believed he should bequeath for religious purposes. It Takes Time

A second Mohawk, the Rev. George Michael White, of the Order of Mary Immaculate, was ordained priest on June 4 of this year. He was born in the Regis Reservation, part in Canada, part in the United States, July 25, 1918. He celebrated his first Solemn Mass at Saint Patrick's, Rochester. The Rev. Michael Jacobs, of the Society of Jesus, the only other ordained Mohawk, preached the sermon. Two vocations in 3 centuries.
