THE TEKAKWITHA CABIN

The site chosen for the Tekakwitha Cabin at Auriesville will be west of the Coliseum and near the Mission Cross. The bungalow office now located there will be removed. There the Cabin will be accessible and an ormament, not interfering with any of the structures that have long been regarded as hallowed marks of the Shrine. Judging from the enthusiasm with which the announcement of it has been received, and the generous offerings made for its erection, it will add to the many favorite features of Osser-

nenon, Kateri's birthplace. Unique is not the best word for it; though there will be nothing like it elsewhere, a shrine in itself containing mural paintings of the story of her life and its Indian background, the history of the Cause for her canonization, and the many precious documents about the Martyrs, Saints Isaac Jogues, Rene Goupil, John Lalande, whose blood just three humdred years ago bedewed the soil on which she was born. Their Tercentenary is being celebrated all over the United States.

A SPECIAL KATERI DEVOTEE

As this is written, the Jesuit Community of Fordham University is in the chapel reciting the Office for the departed for one who was exceptionally devoted to Venerable Telkakwitha, the Reverend Robert Holland, of the Society of Jesus. For many years afflicted with an acute heart ailment he ascribed what health and vigor he had to her intercession. He wore her relic constantly, and he seemed to make light of his affliction, keeping at his

work up to the last. To him we owe the production in English for the first time of the handsome volume containing all that has been written about the saintly Indian Manden, and he also celebrated her in the "Somg of Tekakwitha," written Longfellow style in "Hiawatha." We piously imagine Tekakwitha among the angels welcoming him into his heavenly rest! She will have hosts of devotees to welcome in their time.

TWO MORE DECLARED SAINTS

Blessed John de Britto and Biessed Bernardime Realino, of the Society of Jesus, will be declared Saints on September 22. The first was a Confessor renowned for his zeal and charity, dying 1616; the second, a Martyr, underwent a most cruel death, 1693. They were to have been canonized on the same day as Saint Francesca Xavier Cabrini; but their ceremony was deferred so that the delegates to a general congregation of the Society, beginning in Rome, September 7, might be present at it. The delegates will exceed 100.
