TEKAKWITHA ON TV

The C.B.S. television program, "Lamp Unto My Feet," on February 28, 1954, 10 to 10.30 A.M. E. S. T., will carry a dramatic episode from the life of Kateri Tekakwitha, followed by an interview with the Vice-

MARIAN YEAR PILGRIMAGE

Among the American shrines dedicated to Our Lady, and therefore richly indulgenced this year, proclaimed MARIAN YEAR by the Holy Father, is the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, at Auriesville, New York, birthplace of our Kateri Tekakwitha. It is suggested that friends of Tekakwitha make a pillgrimage to this sacred place during the summer (May to October), and pray there

for Kateri's early Beatification. And it is but a short trip across the Mohawk to the site of her baptism, Tekakwitha Friary, where the process of staking out the actual site of the Caughnawaga Indian village and St. Peter's Chapel, is now being conducted by Rev. Thomas Grassmann, O.F.M. Conv., and his staff of scientists.

KATERI TEKAKWITHA ON LONG ISLAND

Much interest has been aroused by the publication in the New York Sunday News picture supplement of a series of colored photographs relating to the new (1948) Church of the American Martyrs, 216-16 Umion Turnpike, Jamaica, Queens, N. Y. C. Dedicated to St. Isaac Jogues and his Companions, martyred in the years between 1642 and 1650 in New York State and Canada, it has an altar and reredos of hand-hewn

logs, with a log stockade for background. Of particular interest to us are the totem pole and statue of Venerable Kateri Tekakwitha standing outside the church. As Kateri was the first fruit of the martyrdoms at Auriesville, it is our fondest hope that it will not be long before her image can be brought inside the church for public veneration. For that miracles are needed, and plenty of prayer!

NEW BOOKS ON THE LILY

Our brother Postulator for Canada, Father Henri Béchard, S.J., tells us that an Italian biography of Kateri is being prepared by Father Silvio Zarattini, S.J., of Venice, Italy. This publication, we hope, will quicken the prayers of Catholics all over the world to-

wards the happy consummation of our hopes. We have also read in manuscript a fine new biography of the Lily of the Mohawks, by Marie Bruehle, the accomplished author of the Life of St. Maria Goretti. This volume is about ready for printing, and we wish it great success. In Saints Westward, the prolific writer, Donald Attwater, has drawn up a collection of informal biographical sketches of some of the heroic and colorful men and women who planted and watered the seed of the Faith in the Western Hemisphere. The book, published by P. J. Kenedy, New

York City, has, as is only proper, a sympathetic chapter on the Mohawk Maiden, our Kateri. "It is difficult," the author writes, "to think ourselves back into so unfamiliar a life as Kateri's. We know more about it than might be expected, and much less than we should like. But it seems clear that, with more than 3,000 miles and 200 years and an infinity of external differences separating them, Venerable Kateri Tekakwitha belonged to the company of St. Thérèse of Lisieux, followers of 'the little way'."
