GOOD NEWS FROM ROME: CANADIAN BISHOPS AT THE COUNCIL OF VATICAN II PRESENT PETITION TO POPE PAUL FOR THE SPEEDY BEATIFICATION OF VEN. KATERI

is with joy that we convey the good news which was sent from Rome at the end of the Council on Dec. 8. 1965. In October of the last session of the Council, the hierarchy of Canadaincluding 2 cardinals, 16 archbishops, 4 ex-archs and 61 bishops—signed a petition asking the Holy Father to beatify Kateri either before the end of the Council or sometime in the immediate future. Candinal Leger of Quebec presented the request to the Pope in the name of the 88 Canadian Bishops. The Papal Secretarny of State, Cardinal Cicognani, stated that the Holy Father in his gracious response was indeed vivemente interested in this cause and that His Holiness has

strongly recommended it to the competent Sacred Congregation of Rites.

It should be recalled that in the Public Consistory which Pope John XXIII called on Jan. 19, 1961, in the Basilica of St. Peter's, Tekakwitha was honored by having the Dean of the Consistorial Advocates petition His Holiness to hasten the day when the Lily of the Mohawks might be elevated to the ranks of "the Blessed." The following year began the Apostolic Processes for miracles by the Congregation of Rites at Rome which were interrupted during the sessions of the Council from 1962 to 1965.

Need For Renewal of Interest Now

The present Holy Father's lively interest in the cause speaks well for the future and should give impetus to the devotees of Kateri everywhere to continue to storm heaven with their prayers for her beatification and to make special efforts and sacrifices to promote and spread her cause. The daily prayer of all should be that the marvelous Indian maiden of Auriesville, who "dared to be different" in her chaotic time, whose life Pope Pius XI described a "miracle" and whom Pope Pius XII in 1943 declared a "Venerable" of the Church, may soon be offered to our America, to Canada and to the long-suffering peoples of every race, as a model for our times as well as a marvel for our youth.

In this issue of the LILY we present a host of favors granted through the intercession of Ven. Kateri during this last half year. It is a testimony to her power before the throne of God and a further spur to continue to ask her help in our needs.



This statue of Kateri, a chromed wood-carving, the work of the late Frank Feigeler of Cairo, N.Y., is now on display in the Kateri Museum at Auriesville. It will be placed in the remaining niche on the palisaded reredos of the Shrine Coliseum church when Tekakwitha is beatified. The Decree declaring Kateri Venerable, mounted on the background board is read each year by thousands of pilgrims visiting Martyrs Shrine.
