FR. BECHARD'S NEW BOOK ON KATERI: The title of the published work in French is: "L'heroique indienne Kateri Tekakwitha" (Fides Press, Montreal, 1967). Based on the documents of the 17th century, it presents for the first time an objective study of the spirituality of the Lily of the Mohawks in the framework of the spirituality of her time.

He is also completing a work on the Indians at Caughnawaga which will include a new sketch on the life of Kateri.

THE TEKAKWITHA LEAGUE: The membership in the League has increased this past year. Its purpose is the fostering and promoting of devotion to Ven. Kateri Tekakwitha. Members subscribe to the "LILY" and on occasion send contributions to help in the printing of leaflets, holy cards and other promotional literature. An initial contribution and a desire to work for the cause entitles one to membership.

A RECORDING AT CAUGHNAWAGA OF THE IROQUOIS MIXED CHOIR: Their record "The singing of a High Mass" in Iroquois may be ordered through the Credo Recording, 806 South St., Peekskill, N.Y. This is the Mass sung each year at the Martyrs Shrine, Auriesville, N.Y., on Indian Sunday in honor of the Lily of the Mohawks.

PROJECT "TEKAKWITHA VESTMENTS": The Indian Art Center group of Cloistered Dominican Nuns at Union City, N.J., is directing talented Indian women of four tribes to earn a suitable wage. The Lumni tribe in Washington do the weaving, the Navajo, the embroidery and silverwork, the Zuni make vestment clasps and the Yangton Sioux at Marty, N.D., assemble the vestment parts. The project is named for Kateri Tekakwitha.

THE A'E MARIA RADIO HOUR has produced dramatizations of Ven. Kateri at St. Christopher's Inn, Graymoor, Garrison, N.Y. Fr. Thomas, S.A., of the Graymoor Friars has also mailed out for us the Kateri prayer cards.

FROM OUR TEKAKWITHA FILE



An aerial view of Caughnawaga, near Montreal, an Indian Mission founded in the 17th century by the Jesuit Blackrobes and still under their direction. Four thousand of the five thousand Iroquois there are Christian. They hold in great honor Kateri Tekakwitha, the Lily of the Mohawks, who won the admiration of all in the mission where she led a saintly life and died in 1680. Her relics have made the Church of Caughnawaga and the Kateri Museum a place of pilgrimage as well as an important historic monument to the past.

Here recorded are statements excerpted from letters of our correspondents. Official judgment of the favors granted always remains the prerogative of the proper ecclesiastical authorities. Members of the League and friends of Kateri are asked to report to the Vice-postulator any favors and purported miracles that have been granted through Ven. Kateri's clear intercession.
