HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH (All Recite)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered, died, and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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The "Lily of the Mohawks" was born in 1656 at Ossernenon, near Auriesville, N.Y., where Saint Isaac Jogues and Companions werer martyred in 1642-46. Her mother, captive Christian Algonquin, and pagan father died when she was a child unbaptized.

She grew up innocent, industrious, chaste. When eighteen, a missionary came to her people. Baptized Easter, 1676, she was persecuted by her relatives who resented her forsaking their ancestral beliefs. She escaped to Laprairie, Canada, autumn, 1677. She was a model of prayer, love of the Holy Eucharist and of the Blessed Virgin. She received First Communion at Christmas, resisted a second attempt to have her marry, and on the Feast of the Annunciation, 1679, was the first of her people to make the vow of virginity.

She died April 17, 1680. Remarkable cures have been effected by using objects applied to her relics. She is called wonder-worker for the many favors obtained by invoking her aid. The Cause for her beatification is progressing rapidly in Rome.


May 9, 1939, the Cardinals of the Congregation of Rites recommended the Introduction of the Cause for her Beatification and their decision was sanctioned by our Holy Father, Pope Pius XII, May 19.

June 12, 1942, His Holiness approved the decision of the Congregation that Tekakwitha's virtues were heroic. To proclaim this, on January 3, 1943, he signed the Decree in which she is styled — VENERABLE.

June 22, 1980, His Holiness Pope John Paul II declared that this young woman widely known even before her death for her austerity and charity shall be known as BLESSED KATERI TEKAKWITHA.
