
HEARING

Through the teaching on HEARING, children are taught to listen and hear what others are saying. Through respect, the children learn the real meaning of the words they hear. After children hear and understand, they can respond freely.

We start by asking the children to listen to the everyday sounds of God's creation. Then they listen to both human and machine made sounds and recognize their meanings. Sounds people make when they are speaking have a special meaning. This foundation will help the children take steps toward listening to what God is saying. In the Bible stories and sacred stories, and history of their own tribes, children will understand with their mind and heart and learn the ways of living by God's teachings.

Storytelling within the family is the traditional way for children to learn ancient wisdom. The legends of the tribe contain the history of the people and instructions for living the right way. The Scriptures of the Church tell the stories of God's love for his people down through the ages. The best way to really hear these religious stories is to pray to the Holy Spirit for help in understanding the sacred ways of living.


The greatest story of all is the story in the four Gospels about Jesus, who is called THE WORD OF GOD. Jesus is a person who not only told us about his Father's love for us; he showed his love by offering his life on the cross. Children can come to know the stories of faith and respond in love. By listening to their families and teachers and by listening and hearing the word of God during the celebration of the Eucharistic Liturgy, children are given good ways to live.





