OUR CREATOR'S GIVE-AWAY





generations. This would be a good time to stress the traditional values of respect and reverence for everyone and everything in God's creation.


























Thank you, Lord, for our mother, the earth. She feeds and supports us. She gives all kinds of fruits and plants.


Draw some plants and fruits.


Thank you, Creator, for the birds flying in the air, for the fish swimming in the waters,




and for all the animals living on the earth.


Draw some animals.


