

Make me a channel of your peace. It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, in giving of ourselves that we receive, and in dying that we are born to eternal life.

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



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

For to His angels He's given a command to guard you in all of your ways; upon their hands they will bear you up, lest you dash your foot against a stone.



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



RITE OF ORDINATION

Calling of the Candidate

The candidate is called by name and comes forward.

Presentation of the Candidate

Very Reverend John Kasparek, SCJ, President of Sacred Heart School of Theology requests ordination for the candidate.

Election by the Bishop and Consent of the People

Bishop James Sullivan approves the choice of John as a candidate. By their applause, the assembly affirms the decision of the bishop.

Examination of the Candidate

Bishop Sullivan questions John. This examination includes the promises of faithfulness to prayer, service and celibacy.

Promise of Obedience

The deacon candidate kneels. Placing his hands between the hands of the bishop, he promises obedience and respect to the bishop and his successors.

Litany of the Saints

The bishop invites all present to join in prayer for John through the intercession of the saints. The candidate prostrates himself while members of the assembly remain standing.

Native American Honor Song

Laying on of Hands and Prayer of Consecration

The bishop lays his hands on the candidate elect, asking the Holy Spirit to fill John with wisdom and grace. Recalling the servant Jesus as model, the bishop prays a most ancient prayer to which the Assembly responds Amen.

Investiture

John, the newly ordained deacon is vested with the stole and dalmatic by Fr. Julius Armbruster, OSB, Fr. Daniel Madlon, OSB, and his parents, John and Ruth Cavanaugh. The stole and dalmatic are symbols of the office of deacon.

Presentation of the Book of the Gospels

The bishop presents to John the book of the Gaospels saying: "Receive the Gospel of Christ whose herald you now are. Believe what you read, teach what you believe and practice what you preach."
