**The Purification Rite

The Sacred Plant Blessing is a purification rite received by the congregation through the smoke of the sacred plants which are sweet grass, cedar, sage and tobacco. This smoke is fanned by eagle feathers which carries our prayers to the Creator. (Receive the blessing in this manner. Palms up, draw the purifying smoke toward you)

Prayer

Creator God, May the smoke of the sacred plants rise up to you, May it spread through the universe and be a sign of our faithfulness. Bless all of us, let the smoke of the sacred plants make us clean and make us worthy to walk in your presence. We ask you Lord, to hear us as we pray.
