M'No Bimaadiziwin "Living in a Good Way"

I am honoured to submit a witness statement based on Anishinaabe guiding principles: wisdom, truth, love, respect, humility and bravery. A subject expert facilitated an Aboriginal process and ensured relevant information on specific topics such as bereavement, shame, relationships and boundaries. The Lead person generated a dialogue on preserving the sacredness while respecting human being and contributions to the circle. Everyone offered blessings, life lessons and shared experiences and storytelling.

The Kateri Tekakwitha Native Ministry of Ottawa offered the Journey to Wholeness Workshops held from the Fall 2013 to Spring 2014. The uniqueness of this program was participant willingness to learn from each other; educating on post-residential school experiences; addictions and trauma. Each workshop inspired insight for positive changes and reflection relating to a personal faith. These courageous steps were a testament to human dignity. Spirituality interconnected these dialogues fostering a healthy community.

Another collective role was towards healing and reconciliation. Reclaiming cultural values were of a concern to a generation of people speaking their truth. Enriching each other by role-modelling healthy behaviours in a traditional way was necessary for intergenerational Aboriginal people. The educational workshops offered gathering; singing and drumming to inspire another by original teachings.

Community support is needed; respecting cultural beliefs individually, for the family and collectively contributing to the Christian values. Every participant attending the Aboriginal circle may have a spiritual experience honouring their own sacred space and practice. The workshop provided an encouragement to learn about emotional loss related to a cultural gap. Some selected topics reconciling positive role-modelling: Sister, Brother, Aunt and Uncle. Everyone contribution was a compassion of the heart.

Lastly, an Anishinaabe story was shared with the group by one of the workshop participants. This cultural teaching was a traditional dress. Her integrity was a healing journey speaking feminine wisdom and truth. She had smiled eloquently on everyone. Hers lived experiences within a woman's life. Being in the circle, she had opened her heart, listening without judgment, expressing feelings, thoughts and emotions. This dress symbolized Aboriginal healing in a communal and sacred space.

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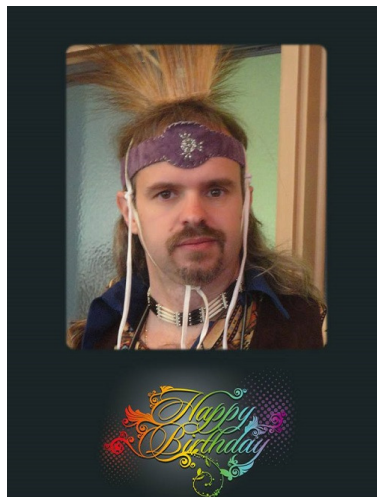
Welcome to our New Board Member
