H OW MANY CATHOLICS, even among the best, know that they are the temples of God: Jean Vanier asked himself recently on T.V. Still Saint Paul repeated it often enough, even to the longshoremen of Corinth: "Didn't you realize that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple." (1 Cor. 3, 16-17)

The Jesuits of the Mohawk Valley and of Kahnawake on the Saint Lawrence River were no more fearful than Saint Paul with his longshoremen of speaking to their flock of the Divine Dwelling within us.

The life of Kateri bears witness to the fact that this teaching was well received. In the spring of 1678, the first chapel of the Sault was built. Kateri and Marie Therese Tegaiaguenta walked around it. Kateri asked where the women would be placed in the chapel. Therese showed her the place reserved for them. Kateri answered that it was true that "it is not in these material temples that God takes most pleasure; our hearts are the sanctuary most agreeable to Him..." Blessed Kateri had quickly absorbed the doctrine by which we become "Monstrances" and "Christophers".

The Fathers who knew her wrote:


"Her courage was heroic; her faithfulness to the service of God, inviolable; her devotion, tender; her tears, as well as her union with God, were constant. She possessed a remarkable gift of prayer without having had any other teacher than the Holy Spirit."

"This young girl... was so filled with the spirit of God, and tasted such sweetness in its possession, that her entire exterior gave testimony of it; her eyes, her gestures, her words, were filled with divine love at such moments. If one were with her, it did not take long to be touched by it, and to become warmed with this heavenly fire."

Let us pray to this young Mohawk maiden to give us her keen sense of the Divine life within us.



The death of Father Béchard

On March 19, 1990, on the feast of St. Joseph, a great ordeal awaited all those who have taken to heart the Cause of Kateri Tekakwitha: Father Henri Béchard died of cardiac arrest.

For several days all those who approached Father Béchard brought to his attention how tired he looked. But as always, he answered that all was well and that he knew how to take a rest. Nevertheless we could not foresee such a sudden end.

At supper, Monday night, he chatted happily with his companions seated around the community table at Immaculate Conception Parish. We mention his happiness because he always looked happy. His well-known phrases were referred to as "béchardisms".

As usual he watched the news on television with his brother companions. He was the only one who remained at his place after the news was over. About 15 or 20 minutes later we found him stretched out on the floor, seemingly lifeless. We administered the anointing of the sick to him. The doctor and three technicians from the Emergency Ambulance Service tried in vain to revive him. Worn threadbare, his heart could no longer react. He had celebrated his 80th birthday last December.

The funeral

The funeral was celebrated in Kahnawake as he would have wished. Mgr. Bernard Hubert, bishop of the diocese of St-Jean-Longueuil, where the Kahnawake reserve is situated, presided the ceremony. About 30 priests from various parts of Canada and the U.S. concelebrated. The liturgical service was certainly enhanced by the exceptional performance of the Mohawk choir. You will find on p. 21 the text of the homily that was given by Father Louis Cyr. The population of Kahnawake and numerous relatives and friends rendered vibrant homage to a life consecrated to the Cause of Blessed Kateri.

The first years

Father Béchard was born December 16, 1909, in Lewiston. He was baptized 3 days later by his uncle Fr. Arthur Hamel, in Ste Marie Parish and received the name of Henri Arthur Rosario. Lewiston is part of the diocese of Portland, Maine, U.S.A. His parents were Advocate Philippe Béchard and Rose-Marie Hamel. He was still quite young when his father died. With his mother, he went to live with his grand-parents in Quincy, Mass. He finished grade eight in a public school in that city. Like many Franco-Americans he oriented himself towards the seminary in Sherbrooke. He studied there for ten years, finished two years in the Business course, one of Junior High and seven in Classic Arts. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in June 1932.

With the Jesuits

It was on September 7 of the same year that he was admitted to the Jesuit novitiate in Sault-au-Récollet. He then followed the long formation of the times for all Jesuits, in spiritual, academic, philosophical and theological studies. At the end of his philosophical studies, he was named professor of Methodology, the equivalent of a tenth grade in secondary schooling, at Jean-de-Brébeuf College.

After three years Fr. Béchard returned to studies in theology. At the end of the three first years in this discipline he was ordained a priest by Mgr. Joseph Charbonneau, Archbishop of Montreal, on August 13, 1944. After completing a final year of theology and a third year of probation, he served for two years as director of scholastics, philosophers and theologians, at Immaculate Conception College.

With the Amerindians

At the the very end of his theological studies Fr. Béchard requested of his Fr. Provincial to minister to the Amerindians of Caughnawaga, now Kahnawake. The parish, named St. Francis Xavier Mission, was founded in 1668. In addition to the apostolate with the aboriginals, Fr. Béchard felt drawn to the historical context of the mission.

His wish was granted in 1948. A new catholic school was built the following year under the jurisdiction of the Federal Government. Fr. Béchard became its first director, a post he held for six years.

On Sept. 25, 1949, he received his nomination as Vice-Postulator for the Cause of Kateri Tekakwitha. From then on we can say that his whole life was consecrated to this gently unassuming Lily.

In 1948 he started the Kateri periodical which was published only in English until 1958. From then on there would be two editions, one in French and one in English. Fr. Béchard single-handedly edited each pamphlet, translating each text according to need either in one or the other language.

From 1959, Fr. Béchard founded and directed the Kateri Center in Montreal. He resided at Immaculate Conception College and at Antoine Daniel Residence where he was Superior from 1968 to 1984. Since the closing of this house he was part of the community of Immaculate Conception Parish until the time of his death.

In addition to the articles in his magazine, Fr. Béchard published a few works in French and English, one of which was the life of Kateri. At the time of his death, two manuscripts were almost ready to be sent to the publishers, a new biography of Kateri in French and the life of Jérôme le Royer de la Dauversière in English. Fr. Béchard had already foreseen the task of translating these two works. It was not going to be his. Others would undertake the task.

We can say that Fr. Béchard's entire active life was centered on the Cause of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. A man of intense spiritual life, he created a great movement of prayer in favor of the Cause. It is this dedication, without a doubt, that led to the beatification of this Iroquois virgin in 1980.

To all those who recommended themselves to Kateri, Fr. Béchard promised to confide their intentions to her, himself. Here is the text of a very meaningful prayer, written by him, that we found on his bedside table on the same evening of his death:

O Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha I bea vou watch over all those whose problems I confide to you spiritual as well as temporal. They believe in you because they know that you loved the Lord Jesus and His gentle Mother during your stay here on earth and that you served them in love and in purity. Take these friends by the hand and lead them through the difficulties of life to the throne of Mother and Son Amen


Well known by all who assisted at the Amerindian gatherings in Canada and the U.S., Fr. Béchard left the legacy of a man who was gentle and meek like those of the gospel who conquer the earth. He did it with graciousness and a smile.

In heaven, he will certainly not stop working for the canonization of Kateri. More than ever we can hope in the near future for the success of the Cause, which was his whole life. Thank you, Fr. Béchard.







HOMILY FOR FATHER HENRI BÉCHARD'S FUNERAL

Scripture: 1.1 John 3/14.16-20

2. Matthew 5/1-12

T HERE ONCE ROAMED, through these wide expanses of ours, a happy, smiling, warm-hearted, noble, meek and peace-loving person.

A gentleman to the core, kindness and goodness his trademarks.

From the ancient, immortal spirits of the earliest inhabitants and immigrants of this continent of ours, he also inherited a gracefulness that melted away any obstacles, much like the spring sun that thaws the creaking ice of our frozen lakes and rivers.

From them he inherited an unassuming and charming smile, that was as refreshing to the woes and sufferings of humankind around him, as the dew drops of early dawn on the parched summer grass.

From them he inherited the irresistible urge to wander, from the sandy and rocky Atlantic coast of his native southern Maine, to the desert expanses of Arizona and to the rolling plains and ranges of Montana, all the while pushing roots ever more deeply into the wintery shores of modern day Hochelaga.

His coveted emblem and ideal: a spotless and unblemished lily from the turtle clan of the Mohawks, whose every footstep between the Mohawk and St. Lawrence valleys became familiar to him, to whose blessed destiny he witnessed in numerous books, articles, congresses, but especially in prayer, and through his unshakable belief in the sacred brotherhood of all peoples, native and immigrant, who have graced and enhanced the waters, forests, mountains and plains of our neighborly lands.

Father Béchard had no enemies, for he was basically a blessed and happy maker of peace, and as such, an eminent son of God.

Violence of whatever kind was absolutely foreign to him for his gentleness was all too happily respectful of divine growth in

humankind, and as such, he felt at home everywhere in these lands of ours, truly his blessed inheritance.

Father Béchard was as merciful and humorous towards the misdemeanors and shortcomings of others as he was with himself. Little wonder, then, that he happily sowed and reaped blessed trust, jovial acceptance and unlimited mercy, wherever he trod.

His unswerving hunger and thirst for justice and equality among all peoples of this land were contagious, and as such, he happily witnessed the change of heart of so many oppressors and oppressed who called on his wisdom.

Father Béchard was not shackled down by the countless donations he needed and constantly solicited to further the cause of saintliness in our clime; and as such, his readily outstretched hand always radiated the happy, selfless possession of the truly poor in spirit, who know very well deep down they have found the Kingdom's most precious pearl and treasure.

His most profound sympathy with the plight and sufferings of others happily made of him a blessed purveyor of solace and comfort to countless numbers of mourners and bereaved.

The freshness and purity of Father Béchard's beaming face, eyes and heart gave him direct access to the innermost impulses of the divine, beating and breathing in our hearts and souls.

And even if his good-naturedness and easy going manner were spared misunderstanding, ridicule, and outright rejection, there can be no doubt that in the untold sufferings of those who confided in him, he carried more than his share of the burden of Christ's Cross. Yet, how could we tell, since he never let on, simply because his steadfast faith in Christ and in Blessed Kateri's assistance made light of every burden with a disarming and ever compassionate smile.

To implement, in the manner of Fr. Béchard, the charter of the beatitudes here below, basically involves building the enduring and permanent happiness of God's Kingdom with one's own hands and heart, from day to day, from here on in, and not only for tomorrow, for the life beyond.

For, to paraphrase the words of Robert Lebel, one of our religious poets from Quebec: "Many are they, and we are among them, who are happy and blessed in everyday life, of whom little notice is ever taken; the blessed of the humble class, who perform no miracles, who never experience ecstasy; the blessed of naught

who never make the headlines nor are mentioned in history books, but who wear their hands out making and earning their daily bread, and who above all unceasingly love their neighbor as well as their God. Yes, truly countless are they, and eternally happy and blessed, all of them, ourselves included, in His Kingdom, as of now." (From Lebel's hymn collection *Printemps de Dieu*, hymn no W-72, Editions Studio SM, Paris)

Thus it is, that the spirit of our risen Christ, our Brother, Savior and Redeemer, gently crossed our daily paths, unassumingly revealing to us in Father Henri's heart, face and hands, his unfathomable love for each and every one of us.

Thus it is, that the holy founders of the Father's Kingdom in our midst, not the least blessed Kateri, mindly of their saintly travels over these waters and lands, reach out to us, sharing their happiness with us and inspiring us with their courage and strength.

Thus it is that, in the words of Saint John, we can ourselves pass through death and into life, because they who have preceded us into the invisible life beyond, laid down their lives in Christ out of love for us, firmly convinced that, in deeds as well as in words, we could ourselves turn our hearts around and do likewise, as happily and lovingly as they did.

Thus it is that our days and nights are enlightened and transfigured by the gentle smiles of Kateri and Father Béchard, hand in hand.

And for all of this, we can be forever grateful, happy and blessed, beginning here and now, in our Father's Kingdom of love.
