ife is what is most precious in the universe. Having life, we can move around, see, think, appreciate, tend towards a life of abundance.

Without life we are but a dead body, which will return to dust. This is why we must respect life, develop it, realize in us a holistic being, grown in all its dimensions. Thus our being becomes what our Creator meant it to be. Who locks himself in a tomb is confined to death. "I will open up the tombs and will let you out", says the Lord, through the mouth of his prophet Ezechiel. And when the Lord called Lazarus out of his tomb, it was to show us that life is always present. Jesus' resurrection means that Jesus can give life where it seems gone. KAHNAWAKE, APRIL 14, 2002



The good news today April 14, 2002, is that just like Kateri was a disciple 370 years ago, en route towards the ultimate goal, we are disciples en route, listening to a stranger, trying to understand our own life story.

We are walking, discussing, trying to make sense of our lives, expecting to be able to

decipher the mysterious events that we come across, whether they be pleasant or crucifying.

Even though God is very discreet, speaks little openly, somewhere along the road his presence is felt; words are heard inside - outside too, a voice softly proposes a key to better understand our own life story. And somehow we get to know for sure that this discreet God - in many ways, a stranger, we welcome Him like the disciples of Emmaus did; He is at the heart of our very existence.

Eventually it becomes obvious that our earthly route which often presents itself as a death alley, really is more often a sentry flooded with light pointing to the Light of lights.

You see, brothers and sisters, the disciples of Emmaus were extremely disappointed and sad at the loss of their Lord and Master, He whom they expected would deliver them from all kinds of oppression and misery. The forces of evil had apparently won over the sweet compassion of their Good Shepherd.

Their new situation, without Jesus, was worse than before.

Kateri must have felt the same; she had developed a closeness, a familiarity with God, a new wisdom that threathened to be taken away from her when she was laughed at, ridiculed, excluded by opposing forces.

Plenty young people today are ridiculed for being chaste and young, for committing themselves to a life of prayer, for deciding to gear up for the Toronto World Youth Day with Jean-Paul II. They too have to struggle to remain grounded in their faith. Yet those who will join the youth of the world in Toronto next July, along with bishops, priests and dedicated lay people, will feel the presence of Jesus especially at the breaking of the bread, that is at the preparation and celebration of the eucharist with Pope John Paul II.

Anybody's life journey is best understood through the history of salvation. There are times when we feel the burden of life's trials, of trails of faith; it is good to know then that we are part of humankind. There are times, when looking at the ultimate goal we sense a new beginning, through the breath of the Holy Spirit. This must have been Kateri's experience too. She remains a model of interior life, of faithful life lived though a mixture of darkness and light. She too must have been tempted to object to God's extreme discreetness, yet comforted by her spiritual experiences.

What a model for our youth today! Sometimes I think that it would be appropriate for you Kahnawake people to write to the Pope and ask for Kateri's canonization next summer when he comes to Canada. You could argue that the lacking miracle needed lies in the faith of generations who have kept alive the devotion to her, and maintained unceasingly the hope that one day she would be officially proclaimed a Saint. This as such is a sort of miracle. The faith of the faithful people should prompt the official church to be daring.

Will there be many from this community in Toronto for the W.Y.D.? I understand the goal of the organizing committee with Tom Dearhouse is to recruit at least ten or a dozen youngsters. Our bishop would be so pleased. His original dream was to send 1000 young people between 16 and 35 from our diocese to this encounter with the Lord, convened by the Pope.

Kindly spread the word, encourage and support those who plan to go. It will be the spiritual experience of their lives. They will walk with Jesus and be reminded of the history of salvation. They will be touched by Him especially at the summit of the encounter when the bread is broken in memory of Jesus.

May the visit of the W.Y.D. cross on May 2 inspire and prompt many to walk behind and become disciples. Let Kateri be in the lead of your group.

The Eucharist heals us

esus told his apostles at the Last Supper, "I no longer call you servants... Instead, I have called you friends" (John 15:15). When Jesus becomes our friend, we no longer have a "dead" picture of him as a mere historical personality who lived two thousand years ago. We come to know him with real spiritual intimacy and have a feel for his personality, just as we would with any close personal friend.

We should ask ourselves, "Has this been my experience? Do I experience an ever-deepening joy in intimacy with Christ? Do I have a real personal relationship with Jesus?" Our Protestant friends, the evangelicals, rightly say we need to have a personal relationship with Jesus and receive him as our personal Savior.

We should examine our consciences to see if we have this habitual, personalized relationship with Jesus. If we do, a far greater power will be released when we receive him in person in the Eucharist.

The Euharist is not merely some abstract, spiritual contact with Jesus. In the Eucharist we have direct physical contact with Jesus. Why is this so important? Matthew 14: 35–36 tells us, "People brought to him all those who were sick and begged him that they might touch only the tassel on his cloak, and as many as touched it were healed." In the Eucharist, we touch Jesus and Jesus touches us.

Our prayer before Communion is a paraphrase of the centurion's words in Matthew 8:13. When we pray, "...but only say the word and I shall be healed," we are in some way replicating the healing faith of that centurion. If we do not merely mouth the words, then this simple prayer of expectancy can bring forth some astonishing results in terms of bodily healing, emotional integration, and spiritual growth.

We need Christ in our hearts; we need the kingdom of God within us. Most of all, we need Christ abiding in us through the Eucharist. We need his corporate presence in the assemblies at the Sacred Liturgy, and we also need a frequent, fervent, personal, intimate contact with Jesus in Holy Communion. The Church has been proclaiming this truth for twenty centuries.

A Sweetened Discovery

ong before the French colonists set foot on North America, the Indians had already discovered the precious liquid that is called maple sap. More precisely, it was the Indian tribes of Eastern Canada and those of the North Eastern United States that had discovered how to collect the sap and to transform it into syrup.

It is said that an Indian, intrigued by the fact that a squirrel was drinking from a broken branch, decided to imitate him, and in doing so discovered the existence of the sweet substance. And, every spring, the Indians had taken the habit of using their tomahawks in order to slit-open the Maples and to collect the sap-water in clay pots.

Therefore, the French colonists learned, from the Indians, the techniques permitting them to savour this precious

sugar, which was very nutritious and energizing. This practice rapidly became a custom which the colonists repeated each time that spring made its' appearance.

The Sugar-Bush cabin that we go to today has greatly improved. Before the Europeans installed themselves in America, Indians were boiling sap-water in ordinary clay pots on small fires protected by a roof of branches. Even today, the method still consists of collecting the sapwater and boiling it until a high quality of syrup is obtained.

A new Shrine dedicated to Blessed Kateri

It's in February 2002 that the cross was erected in Pawkuska, Oklahama. Its dedication to Blessed Kateri is of no surprise since she loved the cross so much, especially because her lover was nailed to it. He so loved the world...
This shrine is due to the initiative of

This shrine is due to the initiative of Mrs Opal Rector, a member of the Osage tribe, who says that she received many favors through the intercession of Blessed Kateri. "My goal is to share my blessings with my tribe who has been through some very troublesome times. I want them to know she is there to intercede for them...My prayer is that it will be a beacon to those who want and need a visible and tangible place for inspiration and meditation, perhaps even to unite them as closely as past decades have served to divide them."

The architect has drawn up exciting plans of a shrine in the back of beautiful trees, a meditation pool with a waterfall overflowing

gigantic boulders with a life-size statue of Kateri close to the 24' cross. Plans also include stations of the cross. Mrs Rector can follow the developments of her shrine from home only, by phone especially, as she is sitting in a wheelchair suffering from cancer and diabetes and receiving treatments of chimotherapy. She can't even go to the Immaculate Conception Church of Pawkuska. But from afar she has suggested the symbols to attach to the Cross: the Trinity, the Crown of Thorns, the Lily and Feathers - all those have been inspired to her by Blessed Kateri herself. "I am very confident, says Mrs Rector, that the Shrine once built, the people will come. The Shrine will be a durable beauty and a beacon, not only for the Osage tribe members but also for all who follow the examle of her lover, devotion and dedication to our Lord Jesus Christ." Let us pray that Blessed Kateri will be canonized OPAL RECTOR soon.

WHY HAVE SO MANY SAINTS?

Pope John Paul seems to be canonizing so many saints, often obscure individuals. What good are saints anyway?

True, this pope has canonized more saints than any pope in more recent times and, I believe, more than all of recent popes put together. And it's true that most of them are pretty unknown to us but they are not unknown to everybody.

Canonization is a process requested and pursued by those interested in the canonization of that individual.

What good do saints do? Prior to Vatican II, we had an almost superstitious-like devotion to the intercession of the saints. Then, with a strongly focused attention to Christ and the Scriptures, many of us dropped the saints like a hot potato. But we needn't have done so.

The communion of saints is important enough to be included as one of the elements of our belief which we express in the Creed each time we pray it. All Saints (Nov. 1) is a feast day. Therefore, we need to take a closer look at the saints and what they could mean to us.

The communion of saints is a powerful symbol of our connectedness to all those who have gone before us who now have new life in God, as well as a profound connection to all living persons and to the earth itself.

The communion of saints speaks of our communal participation in the holiness and love of God, of our sharing in the sacredness of life itself.

Practically speaking, therefore, we are not isolated no matter how alone we think we are. All we have to do is think of that marvellous array of friends of God in heaven and on earth who are our friends also. We can just glow and grow in their love and friendship.

Who are these saints? We hear of a number of them in the Eucharistic prayers. Many of these are not "canonized" saints as

they are early Christian martyrs and saints who were considered holy long before the formal process we now know as canonization had begun.

There are saints who have been formally canonized in the last several centuries. Some are popes and bishops and a goodly number are founders of religious orders of men and women.

When we stop to think of these founders, we realize that many of the orders they founded gave us our Catholic hospitals, schools and other works of mercy that still exist today. That helps us relate to them.

Many others are unknowns who will never be canonized, those who have lived holy lives under difficult circumstances and those who seemingly led ordinary lives under ordinary circumstances.

Theologian Elizabeth Johnson in a recent book, Friends of God and Prophets, offers us a model for reviving a dynamic understanding of saints as friends of God, living creative fidelity in everyday life, thanks to the life-giving work of the Spirit.

Many people we have known and know fall into this company of the redeemed, including ourselves.

Brian Doyle, author of the book Credo, suggests that we need to edit the calendar of the saints to make it more effective and understandable. After all, our faith is centred on a storyteller (Jesus) and based on stories written (Scripture) and told (tradition).


So he suggests, for example, the Apostle Thomas on Dec. 21 could be listed as: "Feast of the guy who just had to put his fingers in Christ's side so becoming the patron saint of all who waiver in their faith which is to say all of us." Think about it.

By remembering the saints and retelling their stories, we bring the compassion for others which they exercised for the love of God into our own lives and into our world. They are remembered as a blessing, as a call to action and fidelity in our lives, as examples for us, and for the strength which their witness gives us in our own daily struggles.

They become our companions on the journey and a symbol of the effective presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives.
