Few human beings are called to do great things. Let us look Γ around us. Some have to take great decisions, but action is not in their power. Often enough we ignore the accomplishments of others because of distance, secrecy or lack of communication. You know two young saints in our Church and you ignore maybe the story of their lives. The little Theresa of the Infant-Jesus lived in Lourdes, in France. Her greatest action in the eyes of men is probably her trip from Lisieux to Rome to beg the Pope to enter the monastery before required age. Once inside the monastery, she lived like other Carmelites, an austere enough life but without flash and brio. She would do ordinary things with a great intention, as for helping a missionary in Vietnam so very tired. She endured sufferings to help her forgive a nun who did not show her any sympathy. She did everything out of love. A personal love for Jesus who suffered so much to save all human beings. Her daily journal is the theology of love.

Kateri Tekakwitha who passed away at the same age as Saint Theresa also accomplished simple things with great love. Living until she was 20 in the Valley of the Mohawks, she could not have been making great thinks but her heart was rich in love. The first time she saw a crucifix she embraced it in all its dimensions and understood the message of suffering behind it. Jesus nailed to the Cross became her lover. Always remaining Indian she lived in a long house sharing all the chores daily like the other girls. Kateri knew how to make baskets, how to sew and harvest the fruits of the garden, how to keep the fire burning in a long house. Once baptized in Fonda at 20 years old, she lived her faith with a great love.

Jesus loves the souls of those who make simple things with a great love.

Chief Garhio Roll

Garhio was Hot Ashes' wife. They had known and loved each other since the age of eight. During the Summer of 1677, the young couple with their children were baptized by Fr. Fremin. She took the name of Wari, Mary, and he, that of Louis Garonhiague (In-Heaven). Their family life was deeply influenced by their new faith and was very happy. Kateri cured the young mother when she was in danger of a miscarriage. Garhio lent effective help to her husband in proselytizing her non-Christian compatriots.

The Pope honors three aborigines of Mexico

A colorful and enthusiastic crewd of more than million Mexicans welcomed John Paul II for the canonization of Juan Diego Cauhtlatoarzin, pilar of the evangelization of the Indians of America and the first among them to be made Saint by the Roman Catholic Church. The crowd rejoiced in seeing the Pope in the streets of Mexico. "Brother John Paul, now you are a Mexican"!, chanting, crying and shouting.

Juan Diego was a Chichimek Indian. The first Indian acceding to sainthood, he is added to the 28 Mexican Saints of whom 27 were canonized by Pope John Paul only. In his youth, he was converted to Catholicism by the Franciscans. The apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary felt by Juan Diego produced extraordinary effects. Before the missionaries had converted 300,000 Indians to the Catholic faith, after that, in seven years only, 8 million aborigines became Catholics.

Vicente Fox, the President, was present at the Pontifical Mass: a way to reconcilate the Church and the State which recognized it but recently. One cannot count the number of pilgrims who went by the cloak of Juan on which was printed the picture of the Virgin, Our Lady of Guadaloupe.

The Pope estimates that the message of the Blessed Virgin to Juan Diego has facilitated the fruitful meeting of two worlds and has become the catalyst of the new Mexican identity. "Mexico needs his Indians and these peoples need Mexico", said the Pope, inviting the people to bring more justice and solidarity.

The Holy Father then proceeded to the beatification of two Zapotek Indians: Juan Bautista and Jacinto de Los Angeles. The two men were inspectors of the Colonial Spanish Church. In reality informants responsible for tracking down immorality and paganism in the aborigines rituals and ceremonies. Today the Church is making use of the visit of the Pope to promote Indian rights and culture, because too many of them are joining the Protestant Church. The Catholics represent but 60% of the population in the region of the San Francisco Cajarios, while it is 90% in the whole of Mexico.

Side-show: Blessed Kateri

Of course, Pope John Paul II stole the show. Ever since he was welcomed by the youth. on Thursday afternoon, he was cheered by the huge crowds, applauded and received many tokens of honor. He was the "father or grandfather" of every one.

At the same time, there was other shows going on, besides the Way of the Cross. Starting Wednesday afternoon, a regular show was given at the Medeival Times Arena. by a group of Frenchmen with Indian participants, all about Kateri Tekakwitha. They had previously spent 11 days in Kahnawake rehearsing for the show, in Kevin Saylor's theatre. One of ther main actors from Kahnawake was Donna Jacobs who helped so much to give an Indian touch to the musical show.

The production came from the talents of Daniel and Anne Facerias, from Lourdes, France. They are well known for having performed in so many countries. With a small budget they succeeded in putting on a fine show which was seen by thousands of young people.

Here's the synopsis of the show: the Indians encounter some foreigners for the first time. The Frenchmen received a very respectul welcome. The Indians found in these newcomers, especially in the missionaries, the presence of the great Spirit whom they had lost. Then because of the fur trade, there was a lot of rivalty between the French, Dutch and British.

Hot Ashes is taken up by this great Spirit and he narrates how a little girl is born, just about losing her eyesight because of small-pox. She also was possessed by the Spirit, her Algoinquin mother being a Catholic. Her lover was Jesus crucified. She had to flee secretly to Laprairie where she meets some of her mothers friends who protect her. Finally because of Kateri and the missionaries, reconcilation and peace are obtained. Whites and Indians dance together.

In his homilies, the Pope alluded twice to Blessed Kateri, a model for the youth. A young Indian girl and a boy came on the stage to testify how Kateri guides them and inspires them.

Before his departure the Pope invited a few groups to thank them for having contributed to the WYD in a special way. Amongst these, a few Indians. Loyd Philipps from Kahnawake offered His Holiness an Indian gift. The Pope said: "I wish before all to greet the young Indians who come from the region where Blessed Kateri lived. Rightly you call her "kaiatanoron", a very noble and dignified person. May she be for you all, a model showing you how young Christians can be the salt and light of the world.

What encouraging propaganda for the Cause of Blessed Kateri!

What hope it gives us for her canonization!



The carpenter said, "I think I understand the situation. Show me the nails and the post-hole digger and I'll be able to do a job that pleases you."




THE TEKAKWITHA CONFERENCE IN EAST LANSING
