# Native people honour memory of Blessed Kateri



For Sarah Valdo, no distance is too great to go to be close to Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. The 89-year-old Acoma, N.M., resident travelled thousands of miles to be present at the 63<sup>rd</sup> annual

Tekakwitha Conference at Michigan State University.

The conference seeks to promote the voice, presence and identity of native Catholics. According to Valdo, the July 31-Aug. 4 conference allowed aboriginal Catholics to affirm their faith under Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha's protection. More than 1,000 people attended.

"I feel close to Kateri. There are so many miracles that she has been responsible for", she said in an interview. "This conference is a way for me to say thank you and pray to her one-on-one. She is here at this conference—I can feel her." Her son Mike is a past president of the Tekakwitha Conference. "It is wonderful to see so many members of the native American Catholic community sharing in evangelization", he said. "We are here to spread the good word of the Blessed Kateri."

Pope John Paul beatified Kateri Tekakwitha in 1980. She was the first North American Indian to be beatified by the Catholic Church. Blessed Kateri was born to a Christian Algonquin

mother and a Mohawk father in 1656 in what is now New York state and fled to Canada at the age of 20 for fear of retribution from neighbours hostile to her faith. In what is now Caughnawaga, Que., she devoted herself to serving needy First Nations people. Blessed Kateri died in 1680. "We are just waiting for one more miracle" said Mike Valdo, who believes the canonization of Kateri is not far away. "We hope that it is soon. There are so many of our native American elders that are passing away. They all had hoped to see Kateri canonized in their lifetime."

"It is a long, long process," he said. "But we all continue to pray. This conference gives us hope. All we can do is be patient and pray. This conference is all about unity and love between different tribes."

Next summer's conference will be held in Sioux Falls, S.D. Welcome!

### Mother Teresa's...

"Let me preach Thee without preaching." writes Mother Teresa of Calcutta, quoting Cardinal Newman, "not by words, but by my example."

In truth, the deeds of Mother Teresa lend significant credibility to her words. Yet people are interested in what she said and this is a book of her savings.

Mother Teresa's mentors were Mary, Therese of Lisieux, John of the Cross and Teresa of Avila but this soon-to-bebeatified modern spiritual master has already been informally canonized a saint by a broad spectrum of humanity. She left an indelible footprint on the history of the 20th century.

The greater part of Mother Teresa: Essential Writings centres on five thematic qualities of her life — focused, prayerful, loving, joyful and fulfilled.

Maalouf profiles the heart of Mother Teresa's vision and the spiritual forces motivating her to found the Missionaries of Charity in 1950 who now carry on her work in India and 100 other countries. She died in September 1997.

Mother Teresa challenged people to think differently and to change their conception and way of life. She was driven by a certain vision and followed a particular path in holiness, all with a clarity of purpose that transcended the image the media had created about her.



"At the end of life," she once said, "we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by "I was hungry and you gave me to eat. I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless and you took me in."

"Hungry not for bread, but hungry for love; naked not only for clothing, but naked for human dignity and respect; homeless not only for want of a room of bricks, but homeless because of rejection. This is Christ in distressing disguise."

Maalouf comments: "When we leave this world, will we leave behind a legacy of love as Mother Teresa did?"

### essential writings

No matter what we do and no matter how many successes we are able to accumulate, if love is not there, no fulfillment is reached and no salvation is possible. "True love is the only satisfying answer to human restlessness, and holiness is the only genuine fullness of life. Mother Teresa had it right." Mother Teresa relied totally on God's providence. She exuded boundless compassion for the poor.

She demonstrated both a contemplative and active "When we leave lifestyle and lived in simplicity. She reflected an astounding, unceasing, radical and contagious joy.

Some have criticized her as Mother Teresa for being too tough, too did?" austere, too obsessed with bodily mortification. Others have objected to the fact that she did not work to change oppressive social structures and also because of her acceptance of charitable donations, regardless of the motives of the giver.

Few, however, doubt the integrity of her vocation. She was neither a philosopher nor a theologian. She simply lived her beliefs in the most simple way. Her writings on suffering, witness, finding Jesus in the face of the poor, family, abortion and becoming holy are worthy of thoughtful reflection.

Suffering is not a punishment, she says. Jesus does not punish. Suffering is a sign that God loves us

Her criterion for assisting someone was not that person's belief, but his or her need. She saw Christ in the poor without inquiring into their backgrounds. "We do not impose our faith on others," she

> claimed. "We try to act in such a way that Christ will make his light and his life shine forth in us and, through us, in the world".

In order to spread joy, joy needs to reign in the family. Peace and war start within one's own home. If we really want peace for the world, let us start by loving one another within our families. If abortion is

permitted in wealthy countries, those countries are the poorest among the poor.

A winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, she claimed it not so much as a social worker but as a religious sister who sought to awaken others into Christ's love and into the duty of becoming holy, no matter what the place, time or circumstance.

### Rosary sales soar in Rome



With wood, plastic or pearl beads held together with silver, string or gold, rosaries are the most popular item on sale by street vendors and in gift shops at the Vatican. And whether someone pays \$300 for a rosary made of intricately filigreed silver or 50 cents for a glow-in-the-dark plastic rosary, sales at the bookshops nearby seem to indicate the beads are not simply souvenirs.

The huge Daughters of St. Paul Bookstore near the Vatican, like other Catholic bookshops nearby, carries a dozen different books and booklets explaining how to pray the rosary.

"People ask for the books all the time," Sister Giovanna said. "I think confessors often assign the recitation of the rosary as penance, and people come here looking for a book explaining how to do it."

Her intuition was confirmed Oct. 16 by a Canadian priest who said a confessor in St. Peter's Basilica that morning assigned him a decade of the rosary as penance. Of course, he did not need to buy a how-to booklet. The how-to books range from a simple list of the order and the texts of prayers to step-by-step approaches for reciting the rosary with youth, in families or in a parish setting.

But the key to many people's choice seems to be the author of the books' reflections on each mystery.

The Daughters of St. Paul said their big seller, at least in Italian, contains reflections by St. Padre Pio . One can also "pray the rosary with" Mother Teresa of Calcutta or St. Therese of Lisieux .

Sue Hooper, visiting the Vatican from Seattle, did not buy any rosaries on her October trip, but said, "I already have two with me and I want to make sure the pope blesses them."

Hooper said she prayed the rosary often as a child in a Catholic school, "but I hadn't prayed it for years. Then I went to Medjugorje," the site

of reported Marian apparitions in Bosnia-Herzegovina. "Now I pray it every day."

As she waited for Pope John Paul's Oct. 16 audience to begin, Sue Roberts of Lancaster, England, said, "I grew up with the rosary, but haven't said it in years." "I did buy one yesterday because I wanted the pope to bless it and to have it as a memento of Rome," she said, adding, "of course I'll use it."

Nunzia, Clara, Marianna and Sergio, members of the youth association of the Shrine of Our Lady of Pompeii, were also at the pope's Oct.16 audience.

The teens, each 14 or 15 years old, said they recite the rosary together as a group each week and usually at home with their families each Saturday during the Marian months of May and October.

But their connection with the rosary goes even deeper — the mysteries of the rosary are the basis for their weekly religious education classes.

"If you recite the rosary with the right spirit, it is a journey of faith," Clara said.

Dominican Father Paul Duffner is director of the Rosary Centre in Portland, Ore., and of a large Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary.


In a telephone interview, the priest said devotion to the rosary "is certainly growing" in the United States. His mailing list includes 20,000 names and increases by more than 100 each month.

"Believe it or not, we get many applications over the Internet" at www.rosary-center.org, he said.

### The lesson of the white geeze

NDLR The text has been edited in the "L'unité Laviolette" Newspaper. We want to share it with you.



This coming Autumn, when you see the geeze heading for the South to spend winter there, in their typical flight in the shaped of "V", you may ask yourself what science has discovered regarding this way so characteristic to fly.

At each flap of wings of every bird current of air ascending is created for the bird who is immediately behind. Flying in "V" shape, the whole flock of geeze, adds at least 71% the distance of the flight that each bird would have flown by himself.

If a goose flies out of formation, it feels suddenly the weight and the resistance of trying to fly alone and rapidly it comes back in formation to profit of the ascending force of the preceding bird.

If we had as much common sense as a goose, we would stay in formation with those quiding to the same destination as us.

When the goose leader is tired, it falls in the wing and another one takes his place. It is

very sensible to take its turn in demanding tasks with our fellow travelers as the white geeze do flying south.

The geeze behind cry constantly to encourage the ones in front to keep their speed and their endurance. What is our message when we cry from behind?

Finally, and this is important, when a goose is sick or wounded from a gun shot and that it falls out of formation, two other geeze leave the formation and follow it till it stops to give help and protection. They stay with the wounded goose as long as it can fly again or die, only at that moment they leave by themselves or join another flock in order to join their own group.

If we all have the common sense of a goose we would support one another.
