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Hope

E ver since Adam and Eve were expelled from the Garden of Eden, humans have been hoping that God would send a Messiah. The prophets promised that it would be sent to the Israelites and to the other nations.

Kateri Tekakwitha had this hope for her nation. When she asked her spiritual Father, Fr Cholenec, to found a congregation of nuns made up of Indian girls only, who would try to evangelize all the Indians of North America, she was told to wait a while.

In this world of today where there are so many sufferings, poverty, abandoned children, what would the people do if they did not have hope in a better world, in a better life?

Heaven: that's our great hope! But so many don't believe in heaven.

Who has seen heaven, will they say? Saint-Paul who had glimpse of heaven, could write: "The eyes have never seen, the ears never heard what will happen in Heaven." Saint John assures us that when we get to heaven, we will see God face to face, and will become like Him, since He will share all what He has with us: His life, His love, His wisdom."

And once more, we celebrate Christmas: the coming of the Messiah. He has really come and not only for the Jews but for all nations of the world. So He gives hope to all of us, hope that we must give to our children, to our neighbors and even to our faraway neighbors. We must be missionaries or evangelizers Saint-Paul says to the Romans:

"Hope for what we don't see, its to wait with constancy."

On this Christmas Day, "may the God of hope, gave us in plenitude in our act of faith, the joy and peace, as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with Hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Rom. 15-13).

In 1677, Joseph Rontagarha, then twenty-five years of age, came to live at the Mission of St. Francis Xavier. He had already been to France and had showed himself a fairly good Christian after his return. Following a hunting expedition with Tiouasteskon, a Mohawk brave, member of the Holy Family Association, he became a devout church-goer. The conversations with his friend led him to a personal love of Christ. He often collected the children of the neighborhood in his longhouse and taught them the Creed and other prayers which were sung at church, much to the satisfaction of the Blackrobes.



Statue of Indian woman unveiled at St. Francis Cathedral

enora Carpio of Isleta Pueblo tried to hold back a wave of emotion at St. Francis Cathedral on Saturday afternoon moments before a new statue of an American Indian religious hero was unveiled.

"She's going to be a saint one day," Carpio said, speaking of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. "We're all praying for her. I hope she'll become a saint before I die."

Women in traditional dresses and bright shawls carried signs from places like Cochiti, Acoma and Sandia pueblos. Drummers and dancers from Jemez and Laguna pueblos performed before the statue was blessed with holy water. "This afternoon, all of us are a part of history," Archbishop Michael Sheehan told a crowd of more than 250 people in front of the church. For many years, he said, he has wanted to have Kateri's statue at the church, "as a sign of my love for her and also as a sign of my love for the Native Americans of the archdiocese." Sheehan commissioned Jemez Pueblo artist Estella Loretto to make the sculpture of Kateri in commemoration of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe's 150th anniversary. Loretto was also moved by the ceremony.



beautiful experience this has been," she said. "... She's really touched my heart. I really did not know her before I got the commission."

This is something good that's come out of the church," said Jackie Chitto, Carpio's daughter. "... I think the Native American people need something like this. Kateri is really important to all of the pueblos around here."

"Native Americans just have this affinity to connect with her," said Carol Naranjo, an artist from Santa Clara Pueblo. "I think she would hear our pleas a lot more than maybe others would. She's just special."

Obituary... Common Sense

Today we mourn the passing of a beloved old friend by the name of Common Sense who has been with us for many years. 
